The three District 5 Z clubs have been busy doing service projects in their communities.



The Zonta Club of Cincinnati is planning on bringing back an event they hosted last fall partnering with the Cincinnati Contemporary Arts Center (CAC) to host a Journey of Healing – The Trauma-Informed Power of Art Exhibit during the 16 Days of Activism. Last year the exhibit opened on Oct. 10 with a reception attended by more than 130 guests and concluded on Oct. 28. The event featured original works from 30 local artists, depicting their personal journeys from trauma to healing and wellness. At the opening, artists shared powerful stories about transforming their pain into art, recounting their experiences of overcoming fear and regaining strength. The exhibit aimed to raise awareness of the lived experiences of survivors and envision a world free of violence against women.

The Zonta Club of Huntington, W.V. continues to hold events and is moving closer to a Charter Ceremony, hopefully this fall.



A LITTLE D5 HISTORY

District 5's oldest clubs are the Zonta Club of Toledo 1 and the Zonta Club of Cleveland, both chartered in 1921. Toledo 1 hosted the Zonta Confederation Convention in 1925 and the Zonta Club of Cincinnati hosted the International Convention in 1954.

Eighteen pilots left Santa Monica, California in the first Women's Air Race Derby of 1929 and fourteen arrived in Cleveland, Ohio. The Cleveland club sponsored a luncheon hosting Amelia Earhart after she flew in the derby. A Cleveland Zontian, Blanche Wilcox Noyes of Lakewood, Ohio, also flew in the derby. The Plain Dealer placed Noyes in fourth place behind Zontian Amelia Earhart.
